Dyann Daley, MD

Co-founder and Director of the Center for the Prevention of Child Maltreatment at Cook Children's Medical Center; Pediatric Anesthesiologist at Cook Children's

Dr. Daley will discuss the impact of childhood trauma on brain development, helping attendees learn to recognize behaviors that indicate trauma exposure, what to do about it, and what we can expect if we do nothing. Dr. Daley's innovative work predicts specific areas where child maltreatment will occur.



Vincent J. Felitti, MD, MS

Co-Principal Investigator of the Adverse Childhood Experiences Study (ACES)

Dr. Felitti – renowned physician, researcher and expert on child trauma – will discuss the staggering results from one of the largest investigations ever conducted to study the impact of childhood trauma on later-life health and well-being. The longest ongoing study of its kind, the study proves the health, social and economic risks that result from childhood trauma. Dr. Felitti will report on the latest findings while providing information on ways to prevent the damage

caused by trauma. The ACE Study, a collaboration between the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Kaiser Permanente's Health Appraisal Clinic in San Diego, has followed more than 17,000 Kaiser patients who volunteered to participate during a routine health screening.



Harold Urschel, III, MD

Chief Medical Strategist, Enterhealth, an addiction disease management company

Dr. Urschel will discuss the impact of trauma on the addicted brain. In his practice, Dr. Urschel uses the most advanced, science-based treatment protocols and pharmacotherapy in client-centered treatment plans that address psychological, spiritual and relational aspects of addiction. He is certified in both neurology and psychiatry.
